## AMENDMENT #2 EDS #D12-1-083

This is an Amendment to the Contract (the "Contract") entered into by and between the Indiana Department of Correction (the "State") and the GEO Group, Inc. (the "Contractor") approved by the last State signatory on February 21, 2011.

In consideration of the mutual undertakings and covenants hereinafter set forth, the parties agree to amend the Contract as follows:

1. Clause #5 of the Contract shall be amended to read as follows:

Assignment; Successors. The Contractor is authorized to assign this Contract to its wholly-owned subsidiary, GEO Corrections and Detention, Inc., provided that Contractor shall continue to be bound by the provisions of *Paragraph 21. Indemnification* of the Contract. Neither Contractor nor its assignee, GEO Corrections and Detention, Inc., shall assign or subcontract the whole or any part of this Contract to any other third party without the State's prior written consent. The Contractor or its assignee, GEO Corrections and Detention, Inc. may assign its right to receive payments to such third parties as the Contractor or its assignee, GEO Corrections and Detention, Inc. may desire without the prior written consent of the State, provided that Contractor or its assignee, GEO Corrections and Detention, Inc. gives written notice (including evidence of such assignment) to the State thirty (30) days in advance of any payment so assigned. The assignment shall cover all unpaid amounts under this Contract and shall not be made to more than one party.

- 2. The allowable population of the STOP Facility is increased to 1066 offenders effective immediately, but subject to an initial increase of no more than seventy two (72) offenders within the first sixty (60) days immediately following execution of the Amendment, and no more than eighty (80) offenders every four (4) months thereafter until the 1066 maximum is reached. Any increase in the population is to be contingent upon Contractor providing a plan, approved by the Indiana Department of Correction, for programming and recreation for the additional offenders.
- 3. Contractor will implement and adhere to the staffing schedule for 1066 offenders which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as <u>Exhibit A</u> effective once the average daily population of the STOP Facility in any month exceeds 852 offenders. Contractor will pro-actively ramp up its staffing so that it can meet the 1066 staffing schedule once the average daily population exceeds 852 offenders.
- 4. Contractor will provide the programming and facility enhancements set forth in <u>Exhibit B</u>, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference effective once the average daily population of the STOP Facility exceeds 852 offenders.
- 5. Contractor will establish a Behavior Management Unit at the STOP facility. This unit will operate as a general population unit with minimal required privileges. Offenders will be assigned in this location for minor rule violations and behavioral issues.
- 6. The eligibility for placement at the STOP facility is expanded to include Indiana Department of Correction adult male offenders who are to serve 1,095 days or less, or adult male offenders assigned by the Indiana Department of Correction to serve as offender workers at the facility.
- 7. The Indiana Department of Correction guarantees payment based on a population of 80% of 1066 offenders at the STOP Facility, to be effective from the first month in which the average daily population of the STOP Facility exceeds 852 offenders.

- 8. Contractor shall include a credit in each monthly billing to the State showing a reduction of \$6,250.00 a month as reimbursement to the State for the cost of administering the Contract. The Contractor acknowledges and agrees that the State monitoring staff shall remain the sole employees of the State, acting independently of the Contractor, and shall report directly to State staff, regardless of any reimbursement made by Contractor hereunder.
- 9. The Contract is further amended by adding the following clause:
  - Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA). Contractor will comply with the Prison Rape Elimination Act of 2003 (Federal Law 42. U.S.C. 15601 ET. Seq.), and with all applicable PREA Standards, State Policies related to PREA, and Standards related to PREA for preventing, detecting, monitoring, investigating, and eradicating any form of sexual abuse within State Facilities/Programs/Offices owned, operated, or contracted. Contractor acknowledges that, in addition to "self-monitoring requirements" the State will conduct announced or unannounced, compliance monitoring to include "on-site" monitoring. Failure to comply with PREA, including PREA Standards and State Policies may result in termination of the contract.
- 10. This action does not change the estimated cost of the Contract as the maximum population at the STOP Facility remains at 1066 offenders. However, the total estimated cost is reduced by \$150,000 to account for the two years of future credit to the Indiana Department of Correction for contract administration, for a total reduction in cost of \$150,000. Total remuneration under the Contract is not to exceed \$25,747,663,50.

All matters set forth in the original Contract and not affected by this Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.



## RE: PROGRAM UPDATE AND GROWTH


The following activities have been implemented to assist in the management of idleness at the facility:

#### Recreation:

- Implementation of new building schedule to include 6 one hour recreation periods alternating by housing units. Allows offenders working or in programming to attend a recreation period.
- Housing Units supplied with chess boards, checkers, dominos, scrabble, and playing cards for in dorm recreation.
- Repairs have been made to all weight equipment. Now fully operational.
- Creation of weekly intramural tournaments. Basketball, pool, ping pong, horseshoes, volley ball, chess, handball.
- Art Contest
- Music, guitars are available to be checked out during recreation periods.
- New release DVD movies Friday evening through Sunday evenings.

#### Library:

- Implementation of new building schedule to include 6 one hour library periods alternating by housing units. Allows offenders working or in programming the opportunity to visit the library.
- Donations and purchase of books, newspapers, monthly magazines, and supplies to increase circulation.
- Upgrade underway to enhance the legal library, will double the computer terminals and will provide a more secure document storage system for the offenders legal work.
- Participating in a State Library Grant Match for the purchase of books for the general library.



**Religious Services:** 

- Chapel is open 7 days a week for different services and/or classes. Christian, Catholic, Muslim, and Jehovah Witness.
- Expanded focus on social addictions, AA, NA, and Gamblers Anonymous.
- Art Therapy Class
- Mentoring sessions
- Classes: Inside Out Dads, Change of Heart, Marriage Enrichment, Celebrate Recovery, Faith and Fathers.
- Bible study groups.

Other programs in process:

- Music Program: Volunteers coach Choir, Band, and Guitar lessons and practice.
- Literacy Lab-an adult multi-level series called "Endeavor". Indy Reads does an assessment for each student to find out the level they are reading at. The Endeavor Series allows them to place the students in groups according to their levels. The highest number of students in one lab would be 20 and Indy Reads would provide about 7 or 8 Reading Coaches.
- Indiana Department of Latino Affairs- workshop on social benefits available in the community. Focus on education, employment, and community involvement.
- Hendricks County Habitat for Humanity: Offenders will build storage barns for Habitat Houses.
- Lions Club Eyeglass Project- Under the supervision of a trained volunteer, Offenders will
  identify prescription, repair, and clean eyeglasses, for the Lions Club to distribute to
  those in needs.

We continue to recruit members of the community to enhance our volunteer base which will allow us to expand the services provided to our offenders.

As we approach a capacity of 1066 Offenders, with a portion of those offenders with up to 30 months left of their sentence, our plan is to institute the following programs:

Department of Labor Program- programs related to Housekeeping, Landscaping, Recycling, and In2Work Food Handling.

Implementation of IDOC Plus Program (Purposeful Living Units Served) in Units 11 & 12. One unit Faith Based and one unit Character Based.

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
