



CONDITIONS OF PROBATION

Do not commit any:

- any new crime, assault, disorderly conduct, any same or similar offense, theft, weapon offense or possession, violation of protection order, prostitution, obstruct legal process/false information, interference with emergency call, public urination, Do not use any alcohol or illegal or non-prescribed mood-altering drugs; testing as Probation determines, Complete the following as directed by Probation, including further related evaluation and programs: anger management program, domestic violence program, chemical health assessment, psychological/psychiatric evaluation/counseling, cognitive skills assessment, sex offender treatment program, Make good-faith efforts to obtain/maintain employment and/or pursue educational program, Have no contact (e.g., in-person, telephone, mail, e-mail, text message, through third parties, etc.) with T.G., C.C. or their families, Name, DOB, and stay away from his/her/their place(s) of employment residence(s) except with a police escort to recover prescription medication, personal clothing, toiletries, and Stay away from Parks, playgrounds or places specifically designed for the use of children, Follow all Probation Rules (see below).

Notice: Probation time served out of custody will not count in a future jail term if the stay is revoked.

PROBATION RULES

It is your responsibility to follow all of these rules of the Hennepin County Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation Adult Field Services ("Probation" or "AFS"). If you have any question about these rules or the conditions of your probation, contact your Probation Officer.

- a. Call your Probation Officer within 48 hours of sentencing and/or release from custody. If you do not have the name and number of your Probation Officer, call Probation Intake (612-348-2110) for further instructions.
b. Obey all laws, including local ordinances.
c. Submit to the electronic and/or physical search of your person and/or premises upon the request of a Probation Officer per the search and seizure policies of the Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation.
d. Report any arrests, charges, or contacts with law enforcement to your Probation Officer within 48 hours.
e. Meet with your Probation Officer as your Probation Officer directs.
f. Keep your Probation Officer informed of your current address, telephone number and employment.
g. Do not leave Minnesota unless you have the permission of your Probation Officer and you comply with all the rules of the "receiving state." Your Probation Officer can help you complete the required forms.
h. Provide verification of your participation in, and completion of, required services, programs or evaluations.
i. If you are required to register as a predatory offender, your Probation Officer will help you with any required registration; this is, however, always your responsibility. If you are homeless and you are required to register, you must check-in on a weekly basis at a local police station.

It is your responsibility to stay in contact with AFS/Probation.
